JUSTIN M. GROENERT TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Justin M. Groenert M '16

Justin Groenert M'16 will deliver the 2022 Graduate Ceremony Commencement Address. Groenert, who earned his master's degree in public administration from USI, is currently the Vice President of Public Policy for the Chattanooga Area Chamber of Commerce in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

Prior to his current position, he served as the Chief of Staff and Legislative Director for the Office of Indiana Treasurer of State. As a lobbyist, policy director and administrator, he has held positions at the Southwest Indiana Chamber, as Senior Advisor for the office of U.S. Congressman Dr. Larry Bucshon and a legislative aide to U.S. Congressman Ron Lewis.

As Vice President of Public Policy, Groenert represents over 2,000 member organizations dealing with various policy matters at the federal, state and local levels for the Tennessee legislature, Office of the Governor, state agencies and local government bodies. He is a registered lobbyist and advocates for the Chamber's policy positions and is responsible for coalition building of grassroots and grass-tops to advocate Chamber policy priorities. Additionally, he develops, writes and implements public policy initiatives for the Chamber.

An active volunteer, Groenert is a member of the Board of Regents for the U.S. Chamber Institute for Organizational Management. He is a past member of the Rotary Club of Evansville and former board member of Hoosier Voices for I-69, the Evansville Trails Coalition, Indiana Chamber Executives Association and was a mayoral appointee for the Evansville Environmental Protection Advisory Committee.

Groenert presented at the Indiana Political Science Association Conference and Midwest Political Science Association Conference on research he conducted while a graduate student at USI. While working for the Southwest Indiana Chamber, he advocated for multiple initiatives including the project that would become the Stone Family Center for Health Sciences.

Prior to attending USI, he earned a bachelor's degree in political science with an emphasis in political communications at Western Kentucky University. He currently resides in Chattanooga, Tennessee.

RONALD S. ROCHON TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Ronald S. Rochon

Dr. Ronald S. Rochon, the University of Southern Indiana's fourth President, will deliver the 2022 College of Nursing and Health Professions Commencement Address. During his first four years as President, Rochon successfully secured over \$124 million in state funding for capital projects and operations from his first two biennial budget presentations to the Indiana Legislature. The University also experienced increased growth in the performance funding metrics for overall degree completion, at-risk degree completion, STEM degree completion, student persistence and on-time graduation rate.

Under his leadership, the University has implemented its third Strategic Plan: Accelerating Impact – which includes goals for improving student success, fostering impactful engagement, elevating the visibility and reputation of the University and strengthening its financial viability, all of which he plans to achieve through collaborative community, regional, state, national and global initiatives. In 2021, his direction attracted the attention of an NCAA Division I conference which led to the University beginning the reclassification process from Division II to Division I athletics. He intentionally guides the University to be a catalyst for change, creating a talented, educated citizenry that meets the entrepreneurial and workforce needs of today's society.

Dr. Rochon was appointed to the Governor's Workforce Cabinet by Indiana Governor Eric J. Holcomb in October 2020 and to the Midwest Higher Education Compact in 2021. An active civic leader, Rochon serves on the boards of WNIN Public Broadcasting, Deaconess Health Systems and the Evansville Regional Economic Partnership, among others, including the NCAA Division I Ohio Valley Conference Board of Presidents and the American Association of Colleges and Universities Board of Directors. Nationally, he serves as a board director for the Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America.

President Rochon earned a bachelor's degree in animal science at Tuskegee University and master's and doctoral degrees from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. His doctoral work was in educational policy studies, with an emphasis in educational history and policy analysis. He joined USI from Buffalo State in Buffalo, New York, after serving as the Inaugural Dean of the School of Education, Associate Vice President for Teacher Education and Professor. He was Director and Co-Founder of the Research Center for Cultural Diversity and Community Renewal at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, as well as Interim Associate Dean and Director of the School of Education. In 2010, he also served as Chair of the Board of the American Association of Colleges of Teacher Education (Washington, DC). His professional teaching career also includes Texas A&M University and Washington State University.

President Rochon and Mrs. Lynn Wade Rochon are both natives of Chicago, Illinois, and reside in Newburgh, Indiana. They are the proud parents of two adult children.



KESTER A. PHILLIPS TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Kester A. Phillips '02

Dr. Kester A. Phillips '02 will deliver the 2022 Commencement Address for the Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education Ceremony. He earned a bachelor's degree in biology from the University of Southern Indiana and currently serves as the Medical Director of Neuro-Oncology at the Ivy Center for Advanced Brain Tumor Treatment and Swedish Neuroscience Institute, Seattle, Washington.

Born in Trinidad and Tobago, West Indies, Phillips received his Doctor of Medicine degree with high honors distinction in 2010 from Ross University School of Medicine, Dominica, West Indies. He completed an internal medicine internship and adult neurology residency at the State University of New York Medical Center. Following this, he completed fellowship training in neuro-oncology at Harvard Medical School, Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center in Boston, Massachusetts, and the University of Virginia Medical Center in Charlottesville, Virginia.

Phillips is board certified in neuro-oncology by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology. He has coauthored several scholarly research articles which provided key insights into the molecular underpinnings of neurodegeneration in Parkinson's disease. He also coauthored several review articles and book chapters on brain and spinal tumors. His research is focused on identifying multi-targeted therapies directed at eliminating cancer stem cells in the nervous system. He is the principal investigator of several therapeutic clinical trials for patients with brain tumors.

Phillips holds memberships in the Massachusetts Society of Clinical Oncology, Beth Israel Deaconess Academy of Medical Educators, Society for Neuro-Oncology, American Academy of Neurology and Ross University School of Medicine Neuroscience Society. He has been recognized for his achievements with numerous awards, including the USA Funds Access to Education Scholarship, the Indiana Black Expo Scholarship, the University of Southern Indiana Black Student Union Academic Excellence Award and a University of Southern Indiana Alumni Association grant. He is a member of the Alpha Kappa chapter of Sigma Zeta and was also inducted into the Golden Key National Honor Society and the Pinnacle Non-Traditional Student Honor Society during his time at USI.

Phillips is actively involved in his community and has mentored high school students, undergraduate students, and numerous medical students and residents. He lives on the Kitsap Peninsula in the Puget Sound region of Washington State. In his spare time, he enjoys gardening, interior design, waterfall hikes, scenic drives along the coast, ferry rides to Washington State islands and long walks on the beaches with his Akita Chow, Bailey.

JAMES W. BECK TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



James W. Beck '92

James W. Beck '92 will deliver the 2022 College of Liberal Arts Commencement Address. He is the Global Vice President of Corporate Communications for Alcoa Corporation, headquartered in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He earned his bachelor's degree in communications with a minor in business administration and was a former editor of *The Shield*, USI's student newspaper.

Immediately after graduation, Beck joined the newsroom of the *Evansville Courier & Press* as a Staff Reporter, covering a variety of beats. After several years of reporting, he earned recognition from the E.W. Scripps Co. and the Associated Press Managing Editors for his reporting and newswriting. He was later promoted, first as an Assistant Editor and finally as the paper's Metro Editor, supervising a team of journalists covering local and regional news.

During his newspaper career, Beck also served for several years as an Adjunct Instructor in USI's Communications Department, teaching news and feature reporting.

In 2008, Beck joined Alcoa as the Manager of Communications at Warrick Operations and later received a promotion to Manager of Government Affairs, representing three separate manufacturing locations in the State of Indiana. He also supervised Alcoa Foundation investments in the region.

In 2015, he joined Alcoa's corporate communications team. In his current role, Beck oversees both internal and external communications for the Fortune 500 company, which has more than 12,000 employees with operating locations across nine countries. Beck also works closely with the company's investor relations team on quarterly earnings announcements and helps oversee all global press releases, including serving as the primary media spokesperson.

Beck has been a member of the USI Foundation Board of Directors since 2017 and has helped provide scholarships for students.

He previously served on various non-profit boards, including the Chamber of Commerce of Southwest Indiana, the United Way of Southwestern Indiana and Keep Evansville Beautiful.

Beck has been recognized for his volunteer efforts by Leadership Everyone, which awarded him a Celebration of Leadership award in 2014, and by Keep Evansville Beautiful, which named him Volunteer of the Year in 2011. He is a member of the Leadership Everyone Class of 2006 and has earned certificates in effective strategy implementation from Indiana University and lean manufacturing from Alcoa.

Beck and his wife, Lara (Sears) Beck '92 live in northern Vanderburgh County. The two met while they were coworkers at *The Shield*. Together, they have two grown children, Andrew Beck and Kaitlyn (Beck) Elpers; and one granddaughter, Tatem Beck.

JANET HELDT BAAS TO DELIVER COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

Janet Heldt Baas '86 will deliver the 2022 Romain College of Business Commencement Address. She earned a bachelor's degree in management from USI. Baas retired in May 2020, completing her career as Senior Vice President and Foundation President for Old National Bank and was also named as the company's "Volunteer of the Year" across five states at her retirement for her commitment to community and servant leadership.

Baas joined Old National Bank as a Management Trainee in 1988 and spent over 32 years with the company in various roles in management and human resources. Through 2016, she maintained her certification from the Society for Human Resource Management and oversaw management and the development of new initiatives in a range of areas, including oversight of various large-scale human resources projects, diversity, work life balance and sustainability, and was instrumental in the development of a corporate-wide volunteer program. She started in her role as the Old National Bank Foundation President in 2005.

As the Director of the Foundation, she worked to create, maintain and manage overall philanthropic strategy, implementation and oversight of measurable outcomes. She managed the oversight of communication, implementation and execution of grants through the online grants management portal. Baas was responsible for communicating strategy and vision both internally and externally for the Old National Bank Foundation and for collaborating with partners to strengthen communities within Old National Bank's expanding service area.

A passionate civic advocate and leader, she has served in key leadership roles, such as the Chair of the Board of Directors for the Evansville Christian Life Center. Other boards that Baas has served on include A Network of Evansville Women, the Indiana Philanthropy Alliance, the Evansville Parks Foundation, the Evansville and Indiana areas of the American Cancer Society, Hispanic Outreach for Latin Americans and Evansville's Celebration of Diversity Lecture Series. As a proud USI alumna, she has volunteered as a student mentor for the USI Alumni Association and served on the Volunteer USI Advisory Council.

Baas is a two-time finalist for the Southwest Indiana Chamber of Commerce ATHENA Award and has received awards for service and leadership from University of Southern Indiana, Old National Bank, the Evansville-Area Human Resources Association and Employer Support for the Guard and Reserve Indiana. Since her retirement, she remains committed to being engaged in the community and has served more recently on the initial creation of the COVID-19 Crisis Response Fund of the Greater Evansville Region where she served on several committees. Currently, she is assisting other community leaders with fundraising efforts for a multimillion-dollar campaign to benefit 10 counties in the Tri-state and local region.

Baas lives in Newburgh, Indiana, with her husband, Scott. She has two sons, Luke and Nick Heldt; one daughter-in-law, Taylor Heldt; one stepdaughter, Erica Bernhardt; one stepson-in-law, Greg Bernhardt; one stepson, Justin Baas; and one grandson, Graham Bernhardt. She holds a master's degree in public service administration from the University of Evansville and a certificate in nonprofit executive leadership from Indiana University.



USI BESTOWS THREE HONORARY DEGREES FOR

This weekend's honorary degree recipients are celebrated in the University of Southern Indiana community for their continued dedication to higher education. The recipients also are active with many civic organizations and non-profits in southern Indiana and the Tri-state.

William C. and Mary R. Stone and Dr. Nadine Coudret will receive honorary Doctor of Laws degrees. The honorary degrees will be bestowed during the Graduate Ceremony.

William (Bill) C. and Mary R. (O'Daniel) Stone will be presented with honorary Doctor of Laws degrees during the Graduate Studies Commencement Ceremony. Both Evansville natives, who met while attending Reitz Memorial High School, have demonstrated their repeated support for the betterment of Southern Indiana through their extraordinary efforts to sponsor a number of major initiatives.

Bill, who has a bachelor's degree in business administration from Marquette University, founded SS&C Technologies, Inc. in 1986 in the basement of his home in Windsor, Connecticut. He has guided SS&C through 55 acquisitions, and the company has grown to more than 25,000 employees and has offices in Europe, Asia, the Middle East, Australia and North America, serving over 18,000 clients. He had continuously served as the company's Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer.

Prior to founding SS&C, Bill worked as a certified public accountant and directed the financial services consulting practice of KPMG LLP in Hartford, Connecticut. Previously, he was Vice President of Administration and Special Investment Services at Advest, Inc., a securities broker/dealer.



William C. and Mary R. Stone

Mary, who has a bachelor's degree in forensic studies from Indiana University, worked as a Probation Officer for Vanderburgh County courts until moving to Connecticut. There, she worked for the state's Department of Administrative Services. She is an avid gardener who shares her knowledge and excitement with fellow gardeners while mentoring novice gardeners. Along with gardening, Mary enjoys agility training and competitions with her dogs.

In 2018, the Stones announced their support of the Stone Family Center for Health Sciences, a partnership

between the University of Southern Indiana, University of Evansville and Indiana University. The educational and research facility for health professionals, located in downtown Evansville, provides training in fields including medicine, dentistry, physician assistant, nursing and occupational therapy.

In 2021, the couple announced a \$34.2 million gift to establish the Mary O'Daniel Stone and Bill Stone Center for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at IU School of Medicine – Evansville. The Center will seek to fundamentally alter and improve the standard of care for people with bipolar disorder and dramatically increase access to psychiatric care for the children and adolescent youth of southwestern Indiana.

Additionally, the Stones have supported the Patricia Browning Stone Sensory Playground at Ascension St. Vincent in Evansville and the NJ Stone Field at Reitz Memorial High School.

Bill and Mary reside in Naples, Florida, and have three adult children—Rob, Justine and Elizabeth.

DISTINGUISHED AND EXTRAORDINARY SERVICE

Dr. Nadine A. Coudret, Dean Emerita of the University of Southern Indiana College of Nursing and Health Professions (CNHP) and Professor Emerita of Nursing is being recognized with an honorary Doctor of Laws degree during the Graduate Studies Commencement Ceremony for her foundational role in establishing USI's nursing and health professions degree programs and her service as a faculty member, administrator and leader in improving the healthcare of the state and region.

Coudret received a bachelor's degree and two master's degrees from the University of Evansville and a doctoral degree in higher education administration from Indiana University. Her clinical practice experience includes hospital and home health nursing. From 1970 to 1988, she was a faculty member and Dean of the University of Evansville Nursing and Health Sciences School.

In 1988, Dr. David L. Rice, USI's founding president, appointed Coudret as the CNHP Inaugural Dean. She served as Dean until her retirement in 2012, having also served as Interim Provost from 2009-10 under former USI President Dr. Linda L. M. Bennett.

During Coudret's tenure as dean, over 6,500 students graduated from the CNHP, and the College received more than \$10 million in external funding, including federal grants from the U.S. Department of Health and

Human Services. Her establishment of on-campus conferences and pioneer development of multiple national and international online nursing and healthcare certificate programs gained national recognition.

She led the development of the USI baccalaureate, master's and doctoral degree nursing programs which were, and continue to be, identified and recognized for their innovation and excellence. Under her leadership, new high-performing programs in occupational therapy, health services, health administration, food and nutrition, dietetics and diagnostic sonography programs were established. USI nursing and health profession graduates are recognized for their professionalism, compassionate care and leadership.

Coudret served on multiple USI committees, including chairing the USI Athletic Council. Professional leadership roles included serving as Indiana State Board of Nursing Chief Examiner and Vice President, Indiana State Nurses Association President, Midwest Alliance in Nursing Chair and National Council of State Boards of Nursing service.

Coudret is the recipient of the Indiana Sagamore of the Wabash award, the Women's YWCA 100 Year award, USI Phenomenal Women award, and leadership awards from the National Gerontology Educator Association, the Indiana Area Health Education Center and the Indiana State Nurses Association.

Her husband, Duke Coudret, who served as Chair of the USI Varsity Club, died in 2007. She has three children, four grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. She lives in Evansville and spends winters in her Florida condo where she enjoys playing golf, tennis and bridge.

UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN INDIANA: KNOWLEDGE FOR LIFE



President Ronald S. Rochon became the fourth president of the University of Southern Indiana in 2018. USI's presidential seal is embossed with the motto *education by the people, education for the people*. One of President Rochon's core messages following his appointment was, "This campus is a community institution. It is, and always will be, the peoples' campus."

From its initial stages of planning in the early 1960s, community leaders have supported the University by providing a solid base for its present success and future growth. For more than 56 years, the University has continued to uphold its mission under the strong leadership of its first three presidents, David L. Rice, H. Ray Hoops, Linda L. M. Bennett and now Rochon.

The University of Southern Indiana was established on September 15, 1965, in the old Centennial School Building, offering classes to 412 students. In 1967 Southern Indiana Higher Education, Inc. (SIHE) raised nearly \$1 million to acquire the land where the campus now sits. The University moved to its present site four miles west of the city limits of Evansville in September 1969. The University graduated its first class of baccalaureate degree students in 1971, and achieved initial North Central Association accreditation in 1974.

USI Today

USI enrolls more than 9,750 undergraduate, dual credit and graduate students in more than 130 areas of study. A public higher education institution located on a beautiful 1,400-acre campus, USI offers programs through the Romain College of Business, College of Liberal Arts, College of Nursing and Health Professions, and the Pott College of Science, Engineering, and Education. The College of Nursing and Health Professions also offers classes at the Stone Family Center for Health Sciences in downtown Evansville. The University offers study-abroad opportunities in many countries and is host to international students from around the globe.

USI is a two-time Carnegie Foundation Community Engaged University and provides continuing education and special programs to more than 20,000 participants annually through Outreach and Engagement. Outreach programs include the administration of Historic New Harmony, USI-Crane Partnership, I-69 Innovation Corridor and Lifelong Learning noncredit programs, among others.

A competitive member of NCAA Division II and the Great Lakes Valley Conference, USI offers 17 varsity intercollegiate men's and women's sports.

Under the leadership of President Rochon, the University continues a tradition of affordable excellence through innovation and engagement, and positions USI as a top choice for high-caliber college students across the state, nationally and internationally.

The University of Southern Indiana's vision states: *USI will be a recognized leader in higher education boldly shaping the future and transforming the lives of our students through exceptional learning and intentional innovation.*

Its mission statement is: *USI is an engaged learning community committed to exceptional education. We exist to provide an educated citizenry that can engage in a civil manner within a community with divergent ideas and cultural differences. We prepare our students to lead and make positive contributions to our state, their communities, and to be lifetime learners in a diverse and global society.*

USI is engaged in its 2021–2025 five-year strategic plan which includes four overarching goals:

- Improve Student Success
- Foster Impactful Engagement
- Elevate Visibility and Reputation
- Strengthen Financial Viability

These four goals, along with the core values of integrity, exceptional education, transformative learning, inclusive and diverse community, and external engagement, are a roadmap for the University's future.

Today, more than 48,000 alumni have been awarded diplomas from the University of Southern Indiana. USI graduates are renowned surgeons, bank executives, artists, leaders in K-12 education, accounting executives, lawyers, nurses, hospital administrators, college professors and elected officials—and they proudly serve as role models in their communities.

COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

Presidential Medallion

During the Middle Ages, medallions signified membership in religious orders and guilds; in the Renaissance, membership in elite orders of knighthood and prominence in government office. Today, colleges and universities strike medallions to commemorate important events and achievements. The University of Southern Indiana Presidential Medallion signifies the authority bestowed upon the president.

Donated by the late Melvin Denner, professor emeritus of biology, and Anne Denner, former instructor in nutrition and biology, and their family, a medallion was fabricated by Honorcraft for the 1995 inauguration of USI President H. Ray Hoops. Dr. Denner served as grand marshal at the University's first inauguration.

For President Rochon's inauguration a new medallion was struck with the updated Seal and a new chain was fabricated. In addition to the names of USI's presidents on the reverse side of the medallion, the new chain was commissioned bearing their names on four separate plates. Made by Medalcraft Mint, Inc., the medallion and chain were underwritten by a generous gift from University trustee and alumnus, Ronald D. Romain '73 and alumna Connie Dartt Romain '74. The former medallion will be on permanent display in the David L. Rice Library's Ruth M. Kleymeyer Hall of Presidents.

During the College of Liberal Arts Ceremony, a replica of the Presidential Medallion will be presented to Anna M. Ardelean, '22. This is the highest honor given to a graduating senior.

Gonfalons

Ceremonial flags called gonfalons originated in the Middle Ages for civil and military processions, often appearing beneath the steel head of a knight's lance. In Italy, gonfalons designated individual Italian republics; the chief magistrate or other high official served as gonfalonier, carrying the banner.

At the University of Southern Indiana, gonfalons represent each major academic unit; faculty members and department heads serve as gonfaloniers. First used in 2005 and presented to the University as a gift from the Campus Store, new gonfalons were needed and fabricated for the 2019 Inauguration Ceremony.

University Seal

The University Seal, originally designed by Nussmeier Engraving and updated in 2018, bears the University's colors—blue, red and white—with gray. The shield signifies the importance of higher education in defending citizens against ignorance.

Between the two banners displaying the University's name appears an open book, illuminated by the torch of knowledge. Trees on either side of the flame suggest not only the University's pastoral southern Indiana setting but also life, growth and continuity.

The open book emphasizes the importance of teaching and learning; *academia populi* and *academia populo* indicate that the University of Southern Indiana is a scholarly academy founded and supported by the motto *education by the people, education for the people*. Finally, the laurel branches to the right and left of the book represent victory: the light of learning overcomes the darkness of ignorance.

University Mace

In the Middle Ages, bodyguards of French and English monarchs carried ceremonial maces. Later, the mace became an important symbol of office in civil processions and academic pageantry. At the University of Southern Indiana, the grand marshal, a distinguished member of the faculty, carries the mace.

A replica of Richard Owen's walking cane serves as the staff for the University Mace. A respected geologist and professor of natural science at Indiana University, Owen was the first president of Purdue University. He was a son of Robert Owen, the Welsh industrialist who established New Harmony, Indiana, as a center for education and enlightened social reform in the early 1800s. The 32-inch tall wooden cane was presented to Richard Owen in 1874. Through the generosity of his descendant, the late Kenneth D. Owen, that cane, lent to USI, served as the grand marshal's staff in all Commencement exercises from 1985 to 1995.

Designed and fabricated by Nicholas Logsdon of Indianapolis, the gold-plated mace bears at the top, above the cane's golden head, an open orb with a replica of the University Seal.

The orb's free-flowing design symbolizes interrelationships among all academic disciplines. Immediately below the cane's orb, three two-inch, golden rings bear the names and appointment dates of the University presidents. The names of Kenneth Dale Owen, Jane Blaffer Owen and James A. Sanders, donors of the mace, appear on a finial near the bottom of the cane replica.

Designed and created by alumnus Kenny Fisher '77, the replica of the cane and its base are made of walnut from the Owen mansion built in New Harmony during the 1830s.

COMMENCEMENT TRADITIONS

Academic Regalia

The academic garb dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads.

Simplified today, the garb serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates, by its color and design, the wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear colors of the institution. The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctoral by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels, usually black, are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree attained and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. Hooding signifies the induction of the graduate into the fellowship of the academy, a welcoming gesture by those who represent the high standards of scholarship and creative achievement.

Doctoral and master's degree candidates will receive hoods distinctive to their degrees. The honorary doctoral hoods of the University of Southern Indiana are black, lined with blue satin with red satin chevrons. They are edged with white velvet. Retired members of the University faculty can be recognized in today's ceremony by the red, white and blue cords or a replica of the Presidential Medallion with a blue ribbon worn with their regalia.

The Distinguished Professor Award is the highest recognition bestowed upon a faculty member at the University of Southern Indiana. Faculty who have received this award can be recognized in today's ceremony by the blue and red stole embroidered with the University Seal worn with their regalia.

Baccalaureate Scholarship Honors

The baccalaureate degree candidate graduating with either a 4.0 or the highest grade point average graduates *summa cum*

laude. Baccalaureate students with a grade point average of 3.80 or higher graduate *magna cum laude*. Those with grade point averages between 3.60 and 3.79 graduate *cum laude*. These achievements are set forth on the individual diplomas. Honor students can be recognized in the Commencement exercises by colored stoles and tassels. Gold indicates *summa cum laude*; red, *magna cum laude*; and blue, *cum laude*.

Because students enrolled in doctoral and master's degree programs are expected to maintain a minimum grade point average of 3.0, and most achieve much higher levels, scholarship honors at Commencement are given only to baccalaureate students.

University Honors Scholars

The designation of University Honors Scholar is awarded to students who successfully complete the Honors Program. They can be recognized in the Commencement ceremony by the white honor cords worn with their regalia.

Alumni Association Pins

Graduates in each ceremony are receiving alumni lapel pins with the University logo as a gift from the University of Southern Indiana Alumni Association. The Alumni Association was organized with the first graduating class in 1971.

Photography During Ceremony

A commercial photographer will take a photo of each graduate as the diploma is presented on stage. A second photograph will be taken as the graduate departs from the stage. Graduates will receive proofs of the photos from which duplicates can be ordered. Family members who wish to take still or video photographs during the ceremony may do so from their seats. Your cooperation ensures the dignity of the Commencement ceremony.
