During this event, we helped students register to vote and students were also able to show proof that they were already registered to vote. We are excited to announce that a total of 143 students stopped by our table during that month! While tabling, we had a lot of students ask us "why should I vote?". This is a very common and valid question that a lot of US citizens ask. Tomorrow is Election Day, and we encourage every USI student to go vote!

Voting gives us the power to make a change in our communities and is a great way for your voice to be heard! Voting, whether it is through a mail-in ballot or in-person, is the best way for us to choose who we want to represent us, not only for President, but for local elections as well. Letter to the University: Addressing Student Concerns

We will remain accountable, motivated, decisive, and open minded in these endeavors". Our goal is to stay true to our mission statement in order to provide the best experiences for USI students.

We understand that there is a lot of uncertainty regarding current events statewide and nationally, especially regarding diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) within higher education. We do not have answers to how these changes may affect USI in the future, however we can listen to your concerns and bring them to the attention of those in administration. The Student Government Association wants all USI students to know that we see you, we hear you, and we want you to know that we are listening to your concerns!

SGA is hosting a Listening Session Public Forum on February 27th from 5:30-7:30pm in UC 2219-2220. This will be a time for students to come and voice their concerns. These can be general concerns that you have about campus and changes that you would like to see, or any questions that you may have. This will not be a time for debate, but you will be able to speak directly to the SGA executive board, including the SGA President, Tamia Smith. The executive members will be listening and taking confidential notes to protect anonymity. We will also create ground rules to make sure that everyone has equal opportunity to speak. From there, we will evaluate your concerns, make recommendations to university leadership, and begin conversations with appropriate University departments.

If you are unable to make it to the public forum, please do not be afraid to reach out and express your concerns to the SGA President! You can contact her through her email or visit during her office hours, which are posted on the SGA Instagram. We plan to address as many concerns as we can as the end of the semester is coming up, and we hope to continue to focus on these concerns with the next SGA leadership!
